WHAT TO AVOID

Prong collars, choke chains, citronella collars, bark collars, electronic shock or "e"-collars, underground fences, and anything else that "teaches" a dog to avoid something because it feels unpleasant. As dogs learn by association, anything present in their environment when feeling the pain of one of these devices can take on an aversive association — other dogs, children, strangers, bicycles, to name a few. When this happens, a dog's desire to avoid the pain of these devices can be transferred to a desire to avoid things in the environment. This leads to aggression toward those things, as the dog attempts to prevent them from causing it pain. Not only do these tools fail to show your dog what the right behavior is to perform, they adversely affect your relationship with your dog and can lead to physical health issues, including skin puntures, spinal chord problems and collapsed tracheas. We also strongly advise against the use of retractible or "flexi" leashes.
